Rigorously preparing each student to succeed in college is the overriding objective in everything we do.

Our Students deserve the very best public education.

93% of all Uplift schools received the State of Texas' two highest ratings (Exemplary or Recognized) in 2010, compared to 55-65% for surrounding districts.

Uplift's oldest school, North Hills Prep, has been ranked in *Newsweek* magazine's top 20 public high schools in the nation for the past five consecutive years.

100% of North Hills graduates have been accepted into college, and 97% of its IB diploma candidates have received the IB diploma (compared to 67% statewide).

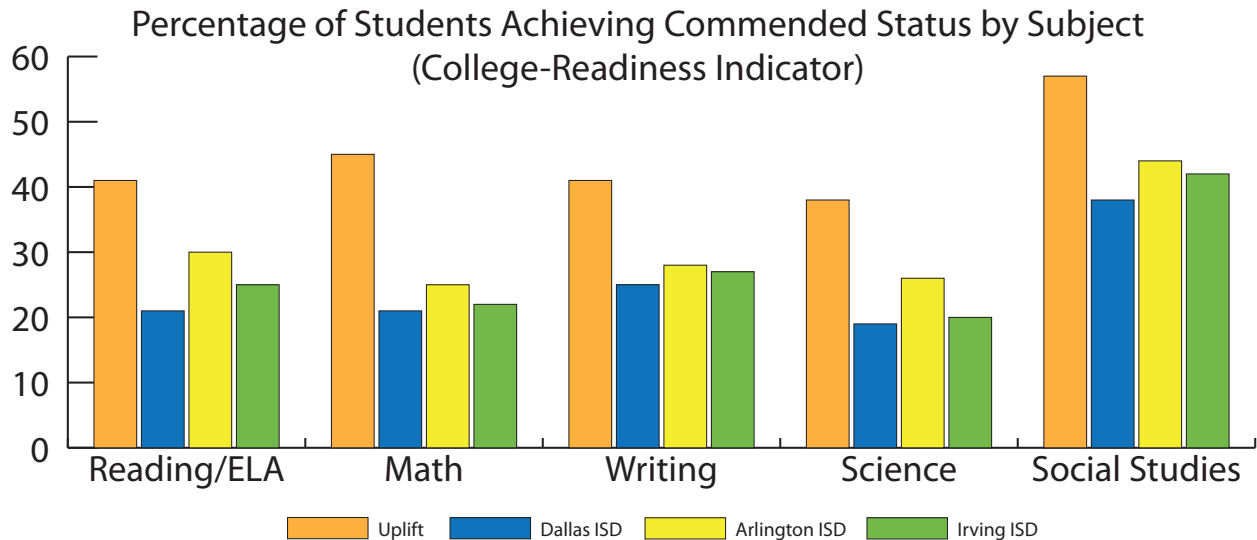
We provide real public school choice to underserved communities.

88% of our first graduating class from Peak Prep, our initial urban campus, will be first generation college students.

Our goal is to grow to 10,000 students served by the end of 2020 while concurrently graduating 1,500 students to college by 2015.

Uplift plans to continue to expand by opening 1-2 new schools per year in communities that need it most.

2010 TAKS Snapshot



- Uplift students outpaced the state on the percent achieving Commended status for all 27 subject-grade combinations tested through TAKS. Uplift outpaced the state's Commended rates by 10 or more points on two-thirds of the tests and by 13 to 26 points on all Math tests.
- The percentage of Uplift students passing portions of the 2010 administration of the TAKS test increased in every subject over 2009 tests, and Commended rates improved in four of the five subject areas.
- There were notable improvements in Math and Science, where Uplift invested significant time and resources based on internal data and testing that showed students were entering Uplift schools with substantial deficiencies in these subjects.
- The percentage of students achieving Commended status increased on both the Math and Science portions of TAKS, with 45 percent of students Commended in Math and 38 percent of students Commended in Science. Both subjects showed marked improvements at the 10th grade level specifically – with double-digit improvements in both passing and Commended rates.
